The 7 member schools of SWPET which make up the co-operative trust originally formed in 2012, are committed to rigorous self-evaluation and continuous school improvement.

Features:

- All schools in the SWPET are graded as good or better by OFSTED (July 2015); OFSTED reports feature the existence of SWPET as a positive framework and structure
- 1,400+ children attend the 7 schools, and are members of the co-operative
- We employ over 200 staff
- 800+ adult members of the co-operative – staff, parents, local community members
- All schools are fully inclusive
- SWPET are recognised regionally, and represented on the PLP Exec

We have a strategic plan, adopted in 2013, which is regularly reviewed by the Trust's Board, and informs individual school improvement plans.

This plan has led to many innovative achievements already, including:

- All teaching staff trained in Co-coaching and Mentoring, with partners in other schools and within schools, leading to a rise in the standards of teaching across the Trust
- Joint SWPET moderation of writing
- Inter-school visits for all of the children
- Joint sports days
- Three joint INSET days
- Commissioning of extra SALT to meet identified needs, and an associated rise in standards of oracy
- Completion of training and associated delivery in 'Talk for Writing' for all staff

In addition, we have produced 2 formal action plans addressing school improvement and support in our schools, one detailing school-to-school support and improvement, the other detailing how we will work together to improve standards in maths across all the schools.

All of these plans are attached, and form the beginning of a strong future for the seven schools that make up SWPET.
