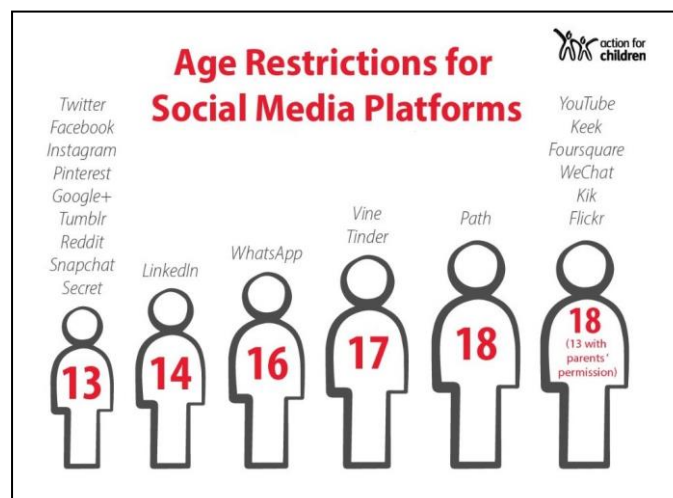

Social Media Awareness

Devon and Cornwall Police has asked the school to share the following information with you:

The police are seeing an increase in the number of calls reporting issues such as children being bullied or exploited online. They have found that the children involved have access to accounts despite them being under the age to do so. This would require false dates of birth to be input at the time of the account being set up and as such they are trying to reduce the risk of these vulnerable people by ensuring parents are aware of the strict age limits required for specified types of social media.
